MORE LIKE JESUS

School can be hard, but it's even harder when kids are mean to each other, whether on purpose or by accident. People throw around the word <u>respect</u> all the time, but sometimes it's hard to know how to <u>be</u> respectful. Here are some guidelines that can help everyone to remember to be more respectful and more like Jesus in their everyday activities.

<u>Listen</u> - If someone else is talking, listen to what they're saying before responding, coming up with your own opinion or totally dismissing what they're saying. You may not agree with what they are saying, but you should wait your turn, pay attention and try not to jump to conclusions.

<u>Think of Others' Feelings</u> - Sometimes things we do or say, or even how we say them, can hurt someone's feelings. Make sure that what you are doing and saying is not purposeful to make another feel badly about themselves.

<u>Say Thank You</u> - When you acknowledge other's efforts and thank them, your thoughtfulness can go a long way to help them feel respected.

<u>Be Kind</u> - Everyone makes mistakes, but the way we react to other's mistakes can make a huge difference. Don't publicly call out others for their mistakes. Instead, pull them aside, gently tell them about the mistake and help them to do better next time.

<u>Don't Change Who You Are to Fit In</u> - Sometimes it might seem like it's easier to just go along with what your peers are doing even if it's the wrong thing to do. But making bad choices can lead to big consequences. Make choices based on what you know is right to do. This will help develop and mature your character to be more like Jesus.

Standifer Gap SDA School encourages our students to abide by the following statements:

- 1. We will respect each other with our words and actions.
- 2. We will try to help students who are disrespected or bullied.
- 3. We will try to include students who are left out.
- 4. If we know that someone is being disrespected or bullied, we will tell an adult at school and an adult at home.
