In part 1 of our Christmas Advent article, we explored how Jesus is God and that through Him everything was created. Peering through the portals of time, we looked back at the Fall of Lucifer, the Creation of Earth, the Fall of Humanity and the Promised Messiah who would come to fix what had been broken with sin. With this big picture understanding of the war in Heaven, the problem with sin and the plan to save humanity, we can then take stories in the Bible, like the Flood, the Tower of Babel and the destruction of Sodom & Gomorrah and view them through the lens of God taking extraordinary emergency intervention measures in order to keep open the avenue for Jesus Christ to come. I love how this concept is translated in The Remedy Bible in Genesis 6:5-6 talking about God's decision to bring the Flood:

"The Lord saw how human beings, by choosing to indulge selfishness, had completely corrupted themselves, destroying in themselves his design of love, and how their every desire was totally selfish and their hearts sought evil all the time. The Lord grieved at their suffering, and his heart ached over humanity's terminal condition. He also grieved at the action his love must take in order to slow the spread of sin and to keep open the avenue for the Messiah to come and save the human species."

This is the story of the entire Old Testament. Waiting for the Messiah to come and save us because our condition is terminal. We are dying in our sin-sickness which is out of harmony with how God designed life to function. But we have hope in healing. We have hope in reconciliation. We have hope in the Messiah who will come and rule as a righteous King, who will bring peace and salvation, who will do the right thing and who will write His perfect law of love (the law of life) in our hearts.
